### **Announcement disseminated through FASK**

The US Consulate General in Almaty have the honor to invite you to the lectures

of the famous American historian Timothy Naftali, who will visit Kazakhstan in the framework of the "One victory" to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the Victory in World War II. Naftali is a well-known public historical commentator, most recently appearing in three PBS documentaries. He has a Ph.D. in History from Harvard, served as a consultant to the Interagency Working Group on Nazi War Crimes, which released 7 million pages on Nazi War Crimes from US government archives, and to the 9/11 Commission before being asked to become the first federal director of the Richard Nixon Library, when that facility became an official presidential archive and museum in 2007. Naftali, currently completing a study on the Kennedy administration to a wider audience, also wrote a biography of President George W. Bush's counterterrorism policy history of the United States and two path-breaking works with the late Russian scholar Aleksandr Fursenko. Naftali and Fursenko were the first scholars to use KGB and Soviet presidium records on the Kennedy and Castro brothers and the Cuban missile crisis of 1962.

In Almaty Tim Naftali will speak on: "The Union: The Secret History of the American-Soviet cooperation during the Second World War" in the Kasteev State Museum of Arts on May 20 at 17.00 and "Kazakhstan in the context of the Cold War" in the State Children's Library on May 21 at 17.00.

The lectures are open to public.
