#### **Seminar 4: Learning about intelligence**

##### **Goals of the seminar**

1. Introduce the topic *Articles: such, so, too, enough*
2. Explain how to use imagination to express thoughts, ideas, experiences and feelings
3. Explain the ways of recognizing patterns of development in lengthy texts [inter-paragraph level] on a range of general and curricular topics

##### **Aspects of the seminar**

1. Using style and register to achieve appropriate degree of formality in a growing variety of written genres on a range of general and curricular topics
2. Reading long texts quickly to understand the content
3. Describing the difference between formal and informal emails

**Task 1.** Ask students to read the email from a British girl called Amy to a friend who lives in Italy. Encourage them to underline the four pieces of information that Amy asks for. Check their answers in open class.

**Task 2.** Ask students to look at the style of the email in exercise 1 and say what things in it are typical of informal emails. Elicit answers from different students around the class

**Task 3.** Ask students to look at the Writing bank and match the topics with the groups of expressions. Elicit more expressions to add to each group.

**Task 4.** In pairs, students imagine they have received Amy’s email. Ask them to make notes about the information she wants. Draw their attention to the example.
