Could there be an argument for eating foods that are often considered unhealthy? The 'Mediterranean Paradox' suggests there is. Areas of southern France, Italy and Spain have diets rich in the foods we often think of as harmful. Cheeses, red meat and wine are all present in these diets at high levels. However, length of life and general health levels are better than in many other areas of the world. Scientists have numerous suggestions as to why a high fat diet doesn't produce high levels of harmful fat in people. One is that it is balanced with a high consumption of fruit, vegetables and pulses. Another, however, suggests that the less stressful lifestyle enjoyed in these areas is a more important factor than diet itself.
