Examination procedure:

Examination is conducted by the Instructor.

Examination tickets are provided by system Univer via the tab of relevant discipline. Student should open the ticket and demonstrate the screen to the Instructor. Examination ticket is consisted of 3 questions.

- 1 – theoretical question
- 2 – sight interpretation of the text
- 3 – simultaneous interpretation of the video

Preparation time – 10 minutes

Answer time – 15 minutes

Regulations:
